

## Hartman for Congress Leadership Program

Christina Hartman is running for Congress because she believes that communities are about taking care of our family, our friends, and our neighbors. Christina understands that a commitment to the community must start with the next generation. Her campaign believes that by empowering students and community members through its Leadership Program, young people in the community -- Fellows -- will have the opportunity to strengthen their understanding of the electoral process, develop leadership skills and actively engage in public service.

Campaign fellows will assist with campaign operations across the district. Fellows will:

- •Recruit and train local volunteers to work together to host phone banks, canvasses, and events
- •Keep campaign offices running at full capacity by assisting with field and communications efforts
- •Organize voter registration drives and other campaign events
- •Maintain the campaign's database

With a focus on community organizing, direct voter contact, and *GOTV*, the Hartman for Congress Leadership Program begins on **October 4<sup>th</sup>** and runs through **Election Day**, **November 8<sup>th</sup>**. The deadline for interested applicants to apply for this session is **Friday**, **September 30<sup>th</sup>**.

While there is scheduling flexibility to the program, qualified candidates must be:

- •Enthusiastic about helping to elect Democrats to office
- •Willing to work a minimum of 4 to 5 shifts a week (shifts are typically 2 to 3 hours)
- •Have a reliable method of transportation or be accessible to being transported by campaign staff
- •Strong communication skills
