KEY POINTS 1/2 – 1/14

- **TAX BILL:** Rep. Meehan launched multiple Tweets, FaceBook posts, and an article, defending the GOP tax bill (“dispelling myths”). Included in an article below is a link to a video of Rep. Meehan speaking on the subject at a recent Ripon event. It is worth watching so that you can see how he is positioning.
- **TRUMP:** Rep. Meehan issued a statement describing Pres. Trump’s “@#\$-hole” comments as “hurtful rhetoric”. On a separate issue, Meehan’s spokesperson issued a statement about Rep. Meehan focusing on making a “meaningful difference” in the lives of people in his district vs worrying about Pres. Trump’s mental/physical health.
- **GERRYMANDERING:** Keep an eye on the PA Supreme Court’s eventual decision on gerrymandering. There is a chance they might throw out the current districts.
- **TRUMPER OR MODERATE?:** Fivethirtyeight Trump score up to 88.5%. Overall voting record at 88.6% with party.

46% of US Living on a \$400 Dollar Cushion

- Article about Meehan and Reed (R-NY) telling Ripon Society how the GOP tax bill will be a lifesaver for Americans, some of whom have only \$400 in savings.
- Meehan: **“One estimate I saw said tax reform will put \$220 billion into people’s pockets next year. That may not all go automatically into spending; about two-thirds of that will go into savings for people. But about one-third will find its way into the economy. More than 46 percent of Americans are living on a \$400 dollar cushion. Think about that – almost half the people. If they had a problem I had this week where my refrigerator went out, that’s a cataclysmic event for them. So when you start to bring money back to them, that’s the kind of thing that can make a difference.”**
- Meehan says: **“That gives us a great opportunity when we go back and talk to people, and people get to see the benefits in their checks, the cash in their savings accounts, and the opportunities that they are going to have with the potential jobs that are going to come online.”**



What the bill does

The Rapid DNA Act establishes a system for Rapid DNA’s nationwide coordination among law enforcement departments, by connecting it to the FBI’s Combined DNA Index System.

Labelled [S. 139](#) in the Senate and [H.R. 510](#) in the House, the legislation was introduced by Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Rep. James Sensenbrenner (R-WI5).

Former FBI Director James Comey cited a real-life example of how the technology could be used effectively. “[It will] allow us, in booking stations around the country, if someone’s arrested, to know instantly – or near instantly – whether that person is the rapist who’s been on the loose in a particular community before they’re released on bail and get away or to clear somebody, to show that they’re not the person,” Comey [said in testimony](#).

Rapid DNA was used for the [first time ever in a criminal investigation in 2013](#), to nab burglars who stole more than \$30,000 worth of items from an Air Force Member’s Florida home while they were serving in Afghanistan. Presumably more such cases would be solved and quickly with expanded use of rapid DNA.

What supporters say

Supporters say it will save both time and taxpayer dollars by speeding up the DNA analysis process in a manner that's no less effective, reducing the backlog of samples waiting to be tested.

"It will enable officers to take advantage of exciting new developments in DNA technology to more quickly solve crimes and exonerate innocent suspects," Senate lead sponsor Hatch [said in a press release](#). "Under this legislation, rather than having to all send DNA samples to crime labs and wait weeks for results, trained officers will be able to process many samples in less than two hours."

What opponents say

GovTrack Insider could not locate any members of Congress who expressed public opposition to the legislation, but some members of the public are concerned. The *New Republic* called the rise of rapid DNA "[troubling](#)," citing the potential for privacy violations and misuses by immigration authorities. They also noted that the FBI already has DNA samples from more than 3.5 percent of Americans, a number likely to grow thanks to a 2015 Supreme Court decision allowing DNA samples to be taken without a warrant.

The Electronic Frontier Foundation expressed doubts about the accuracy of Rapid DNA. "Rapid DNA has only been tested on single-source samples — like a swab taken directly from a person's inner cheek," the EFF [writes](#). "And yet, Rapid DNA manufacturers are trying to convince law enforcement agencies to buy these machines to get through their backlog of rape kits and for low-level property crimes — situations where there's a very good chance the DNA came from multiple people — some of whom may have had no connection to the crime at all."

Countable says: “This bill would clarify that the White Mountain Apache Tribe (WMAT) is authorized to use funds from the \$79 million WMAT settlement fund to plan, design, and build a rural water system. The bill was amended to include the Tribal Labor Sovereignty Act, which would codify the National Labor Relations Board’s (NLRB) pre-2004 policy that specified any enterprise or institution owned and operated by an Indian tribe on tribal land isn’t considered an “employer” and is exempt from the National Labor Relations Act. Since then, NLRB determines its jurisdiction over tribal enterprises on a case-by-case basis, and asserts that jurisdiction unless the enterprise carries out traditional or governmental functions.

Further, the bill was amended to clarify that the 99-year leasing authority granted to the Santa Clara and Ohkay Owingeh Pueblos also extends to leasing their restricted fee lands (which are currently limited to 10 year leases with a single, 25-year renewal).”

Countable says: “This resolution would express that the House of Representatives stands with the people of Iran who are peacefully protesting against the country’s regime and condemns the regime’s human rights abuses, corruption, and destabilizing activities abroad. It would demand that the regime abide by its international obligations to respect human rights and civil liberties such as freedoms of assembly, speech, and press. The resolution would support efforts by the Iranian people to build the foundation for the emergence of a freely elected, open, and democratic political system.

Further, it would call on the executive branch to impose targeted sanctions and convene emergency sessions of the United Nations Security and Human Rights Councils to condemn the ongoing human rights violations. The resolution would also encourage companies to reject requests by the Iranian regime to cut off the people’s access to social media and other communications platforms.

As a simple resolution, this legislation is non-binding and wouldn’t be considered by the Senate if passed.”


