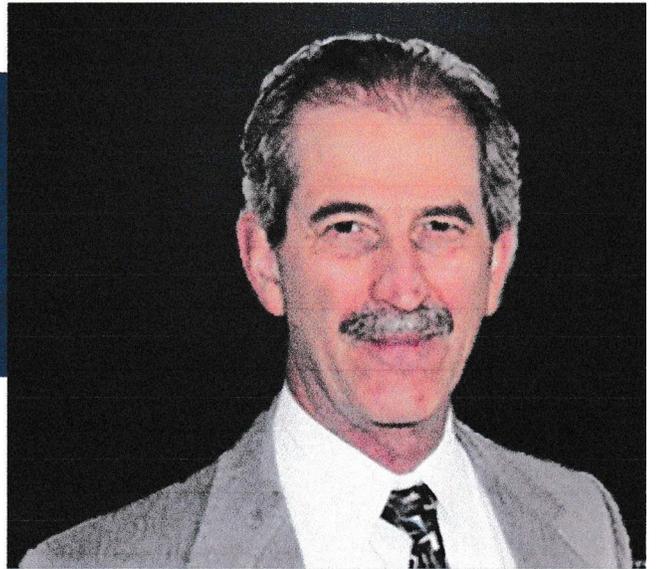




JOHN J. HELLMANN, III
