- 1. TO VOTE YOU MUST COMPLETELY BLACKEN THE OVAL (●) TO THE LEFT OF YOUR CHOICE. An oval (●) blackened to the left of the name of any candidate indicates a vote for that candidate
- 2. To cast a write-in vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, you must blacken the oval (•) to the left of the line provided, and write or print the name in the blank space provided for that purpose.
- 3. Use only black ink pen.
- 4. If you make a mistake DO NOT ERASE. Ask for a new ballot.

Instructions on Returning your Mall In Ballot

- 1) Carefully mark your <u>ballot</u>. Complete both sides. Use the flip side of this sample ballot for our recommendations.
- 2) Put your marked ballot in the <u>secrecy</u> envelope and seal the envelope. If you don't use the secrecy envelope, your ballot will not count!
- 3) Put the sealed secrecy envelope (containing your ballot) inside the large return envelope.
- 4) Fill out the <u>voter declaration</u> on the outside of the large return envelope. <u>Sign and date</u> the voter declaration with today's date.
- 5) Return your ballot by mail by Oct. 21 or use a <u>ballot drop box</u> (find the nearest drop box using the QR code below). You may only return your own ballot. Voter Services must receive it by 8:00 PM on Election Day.

Dear Voter.

Three Pennsylvania Supreme Court justices - Christine Donohue, Kevin Dougherty, and David Wecht - are up for retention this election, and it is crucial for Pennsylvania that they DEMOCRATS succeed. Republican national political groups are pouring money into our state in their effort

to influence our elections, which means EVERY "YES" TO RETAIN VOTE MATTERS if we want to protect our judicial independence, our state rights, and our individual rights as Pennsylvanians and Chester County residents.

What is at stake?

- Upholding voting laws and voting rights in Pennsylvania, and insuring Republican's unprecedented push for mid-decade redistricting in red states to gain an advantage in future elections is not allowed here in Pennsylvania.
- Avoiding an unstable situation with our Supreme Court: if voters do not retain our judges, the loss of three judges could result in an ideological 2-2 split with three vacancies if the Republican-controlled State Senate blocks Governor Josh Shapiro's temporary appointments. This could severely hinder the court's ability to adjudicate cases.
- Protecting health care access and an individual's right to choose what healthcare is best for them without government interference.

Also on the ballot this cycle are our important local positions - school boards, township supervisors, Judges of Elections and Inspector of Elections.

The protection of our democracy starts in our own backyard, which is why voting Democratic for each of these positions is so very important. Check in on your Democratic family, friends, and neighbors to make sure they know the importance of this election and to assure they have a plan to vote.

And please make sure to vote both sides of the ballot to ensure no Democratic vote is lost.
